



## January 9, 2026

The 103<sup>rd</sup> General Assembly, Second Regular Session started Wednesday, January 7<sup>th</sup> and closes on Friday, May 15<sup>th</sup>. We will send weekly updates during the legislative session recapping relevant bill actions that occurred during the week, plus a schedule of upcoming hearings on bills of interest.
