Two weeks left of the Legislative Session. The failure to appear SB 1087 stalled this week in Senate, do to lobbying of Senator Eric Schmitt who is oppose changes to his SB 5 legislation passed in 2015. We continue to monitor key legislation related to building permits (Rep. Murphy HB 1791), right of way utility relocation (Sen. Brown SB 1065), Landbank (Rep. Owen HB 2898) and sovereign immunity (Sen. Burger SB 916).
