On Wednesday May 6th, the General Assembly passed sixteen spending bills representing a \$50.7 billion budget for the state's fiscal year ending June 30, 2027. It utilizes \$2.3 billion from the general revenue surplus to cover a revenue deficit—likely the last time that much money will be available to balance the budget.
